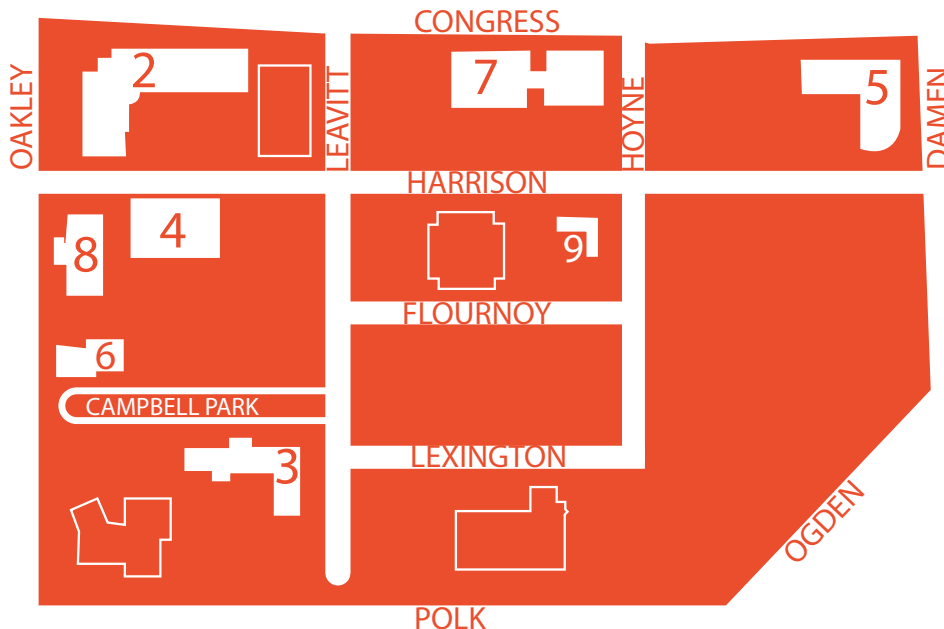

### To get to the CTP:

#### with the CTA (public transit):

#### from the Art Institute of Chicago:

Take CTA bus #126 Jackson Westbound from Adams & Wabash TO Jackson & Leavitt

The CTP is 0.3 mile South

#### from the CTA Headquarters:

Take CTA Blue Line Train (to Forest Park) from Clark/Lake CTA TO Western CTA

The CTP is 0.5 mile South

#### General Directions:

The CTP is 2 miles West of Downtown, just South of the Eisenhower Expressway (I-290).
